Quarter 2: Curriculum At A Glance:

ELA: Biodiversity in the Rainforest—The Most Beautiful Roof in the World

We will be learning the different ways in which informational texts are structured and what the author's purpose is in providing the information in different ways. We will also continue our practice of summarizing parts of a text as well as determining the meaning of grade level vocabulary. In addition, we will discuss how different points of view influence how information is presented within a text. We will conduct a research based writing assignment centered around the rainforest as well as a personal narrative about a specific event from our text, *The Most Beautiful Roof in the World*.

MATH:

We will begin the quarter learning how to multiply & divide fractions by whole numbers as well as how to connect fractions to division.

SCIENCE:

We will be discussing the different components and aspects of various Ecosystems including: Symbiotic Relationships, Food Chains/Webs, Climate, and Human Effects.

SOCIAL STUDIES:

We will discuss the formation of our nation's government and the Westward Expansion of the United States.
